Hi, and welcome to The SazCo.

The SazCo was started by myself Sal Ormandji, I was born in London, England in 1972 and I have been playing the traditional Turkish instrument the "saz" since I was I0 years old. After decades of experience playing this beautiful instrument, I decided to launch my own brand of electric saz guitars so guitar players from all over the world can enjoy playing and bringing new light to this ancient and wonderful instrument.

"Saz" refers to a family of long-necked lutes, also means a musical instrument in Arabic. These plucked instruments date back to the Ottoman Empire, and the music they create is steeped in Turkish history and tradition. If you ever travel to Turkey, you'll find people playing the saz in coffee houses, in their homes, at weddings and other socialgatherings.

The SazCo Electric Guitar has taken me over 4 years to research, design & develop a product that is truly a unique piece of art. I wanted to create an Electric Saz Guitar that is very different in not only the look of the Saz Guitar but also I wanted to eliminate a few of the components that are on a traditional Electric Saz.

After years of research and a few visits to Istanbul - Turkey to get some inspiration I started to design the SazCo SN_XI.

I first started to design the main headstock of the guitar which took 3 months to perfect the shape and also to make sure that it functions well with the 6 strings and the mechanical tuners that I wanted to use on the SazCo SN_XI.

I then started to work on the neck and the fretboard. The fretboard consists of 23 inlaid frets, this was a major change for an Electric Saz, as traditionally the frets are basically fish wire but I wanted to use inlaid frets as like on a guitar so I used specially made inlaid frets to be used on the SazCo SN_XI so it was comfortable to play as like on a standard fretboard on a Saz. The notes on a Sazco SN_XI fretboard are unique as there is also quarter notes so the player will be able to bring some new tones and sounds to their solo's, riffs and melodies that they play.

Finally, I started to design the Body of the SazCo SN_XI, this was a true challenge as I wanted to eliminate a few elements such as a built-in EQ, fine tuners and tone switches. After many months of research and experimentation with our luthier, we designed the body and chose the correct components that will work well and compliment the instrument.

I wanted to create a unique Electric Saz guitar that any guitarist in the world of all cultures and musical backgrounds can play and enjoy the sound and feel of a SazCo Electric Saz Guitar.

TheSazCo is a great instrument to pick up no matter what your skill level is, also remember most great saz players are self-taught and if you have some experience playing a guitar or another stringed instrument, you'll be able to pick up the art of playing a SazCo Electric Saz in no time.

I hope you enjoy playing this unique Electric Saz Guitar as much as I enjoyed making them!


In addition, it took Sal Ormandji over four months designing and developing the headstock design to create a unique look, shape, and design. The headstock was designed as a 3D model, then it was 3D printed in resin for testing then we made some final adjustments. The headstocks on all of our models will be laser cut using the latest CNC machinery using cherry wood to create a beautiful finish.

All of the components used on SazCo's line of products come from well-known manufacturers from all over the world. These include Pyramid (strings from Germany), Seymour Duncan (pickups from the USA), and Schaller (mechanical tuners from Germany). These companies love the SazCo SN_XI instruments that we have created, and we are excited to partner with them to continue developing our high-quality instruments.






The SazCo SN_XI - Construction











The SN_XI Headstock


When Sal Ormandji began his journey to develop his dream to design the SazCo Electric Saz Guitar obviously the headstock would have to be particularly special and unique aswell. The headstock took over 6 months to perfect, from the initial design sketches to the final CNC'd version.

The design had to be unique in a way that obviously dosnt look like any other well known headstock design, so Sal Ormandji also being a professional Graphic & 3D Designer he wanted to design a very elegant and artistic looking headstock. The headstock was first modelled as a 3D model, this was done in this way so that the design can be seen as a real object in real time.

Sal Ormandji wanted to also align all of the strings to each of the mechanical tuners, so this was also a challenging part of the design process. The first SN_XI Electric Saz Guitar Original model had 3 parts to the whole guitar, the CNC'd Headstock made from maple wood and the neck then the

With the new series the Black Panther and the White Pearl the headstock, the neck and the body are all CNC"d from one piece of cherry wood, this ensures that all of the Electric Saz Guitars will be the same and consistant in the manufacturing process.

Overall we are very happy with the headstock design and it is well recieved with many people who have seen it and who have played the Electric Saz Guitar.



The headstock is designed in 3D then the model is converted into a CAD file.








Our first 3D printed headstock design

The highlighted notes in yellow Q are the 6 quarter tone notes often called Semi Tones, these are unique to a Saz instrument and will add an extra tonal sound to when your playing melodies, solo's and riffs.


Below is some of the standard chords that you can start playing to get you used to the note positions on the SazCo Electric Saz Guitar.
